Our Chippewa River Writing Camp at Westwood Elementary School (Room A113) will encourage your young writer to become more confident & creative. Together we'll share a love for writing, and a whole lot of fun.

Let your child join us on an exciting journey through engaging activities as we live out our "writerly lives." For just \$100, your child will receive **five** full days of camp (Mon-Fri, 9-3:30), as well as snacks, a writer's journal, a camp t-shirt, and a copy our camp anthology.

There will be ample time to explore, create, revise and revisit some favorite activities. We will have a writing marathon around town on Thursday to explore the idea of place-based writing (more specific details to follow). We will wrap up our week with a Publication Celebration on Friday afternoon where parents, grandparents and friends are welcome to come celebrate the work these young writers put into their Maker Creations for the week!
